Year 9/10 Business

This semester in Business the students have been looking at financial decisions made by individuals and businesses.

We have been focusing on discussions of the inquiry question: How do governments, businesses and individuals respond to changing economic conditions?



In Term Three, the students looked at the personal, cultural and financial factors that need to be considered when making a major, personal, financial decision. The assessment was based on the purchase of a new vehicle, and students needed to look at wants versus needs, interest rates, and ongoing costs to help in making a decision. They then had to justify their choice.



In Term Four, we are looking at similar decision-making processes, but this time with businesses. The students have looked at how changes in the financial market impacts decisions businesses make regarding human resources, sales, marketing etc. The task this term is a folio of work, so the students are completing different activities each fortnight that are then compiled into a folio.

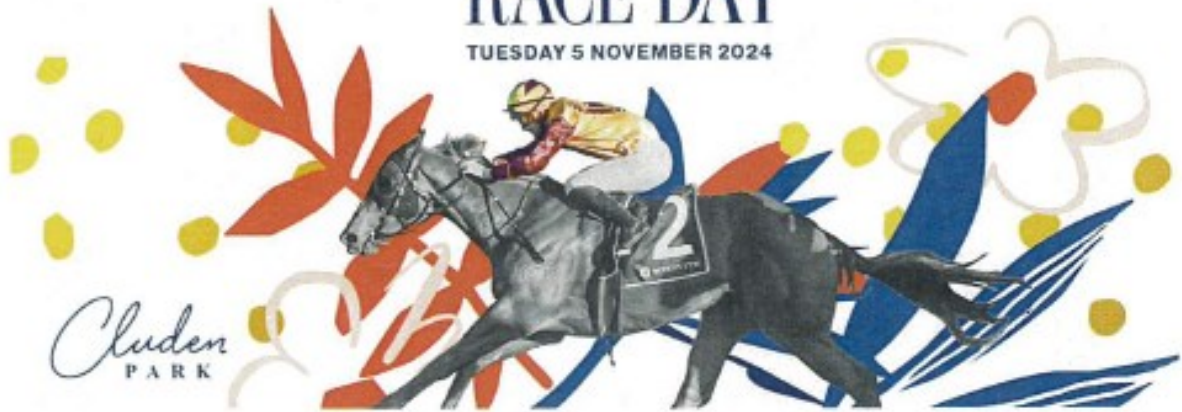
